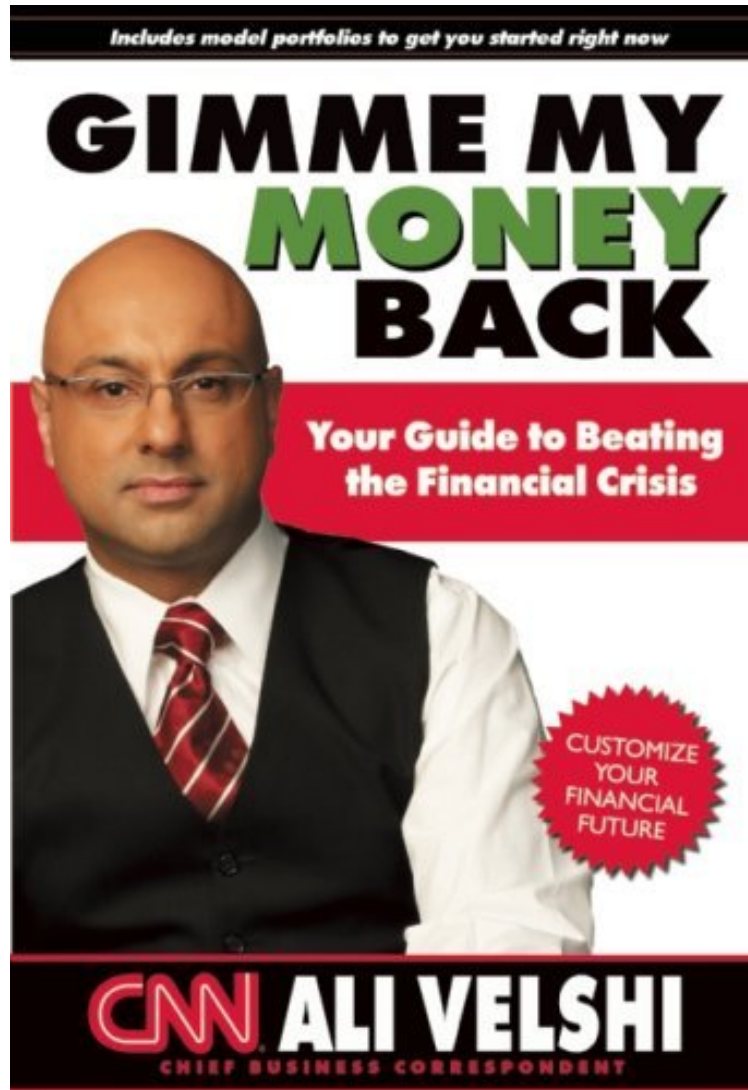

His book shares these qualities, but I was expecting more depth. The book took me a little over an hour to read and contained nothing beyond what can be found on the Internet for free from major investor publications. He promotes diversification (which is consistent with everyone else) and has a new

slant on how to divide the pie. He includes "alternatives" in his suggested allocations, but never really defines what alternatives are, how to evaluate them, or even give examples. But what is particularly annoying was the "coming attractions" at the conclusion of each chapter to inform the reader what the next chapter will contain(!).
