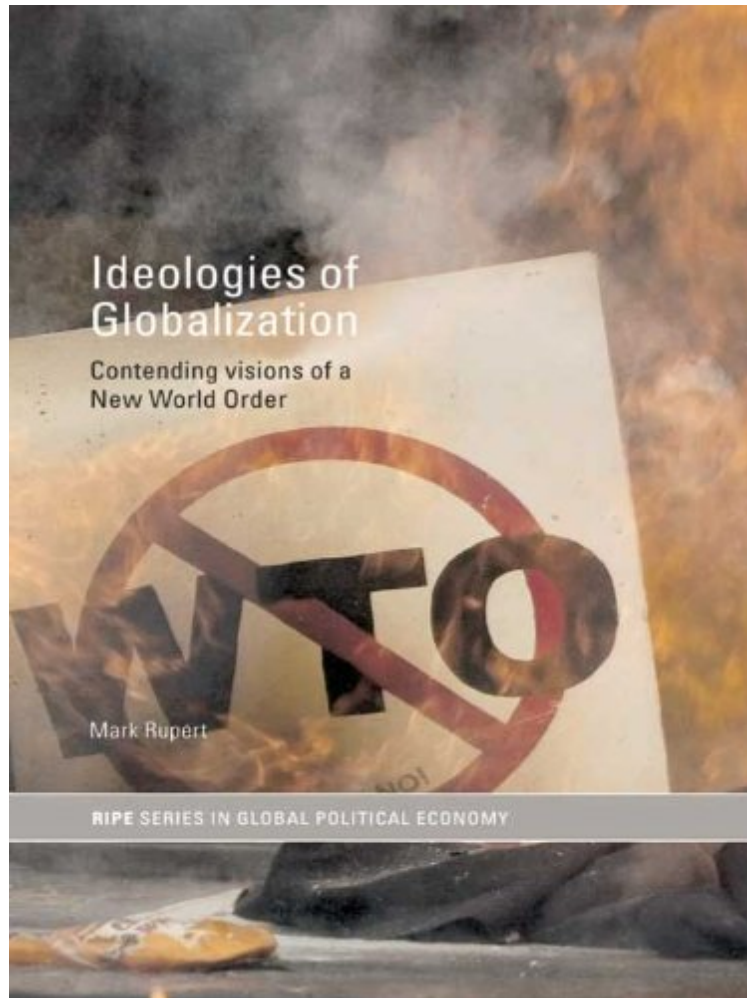

conservatism coping with the "New World Order."
