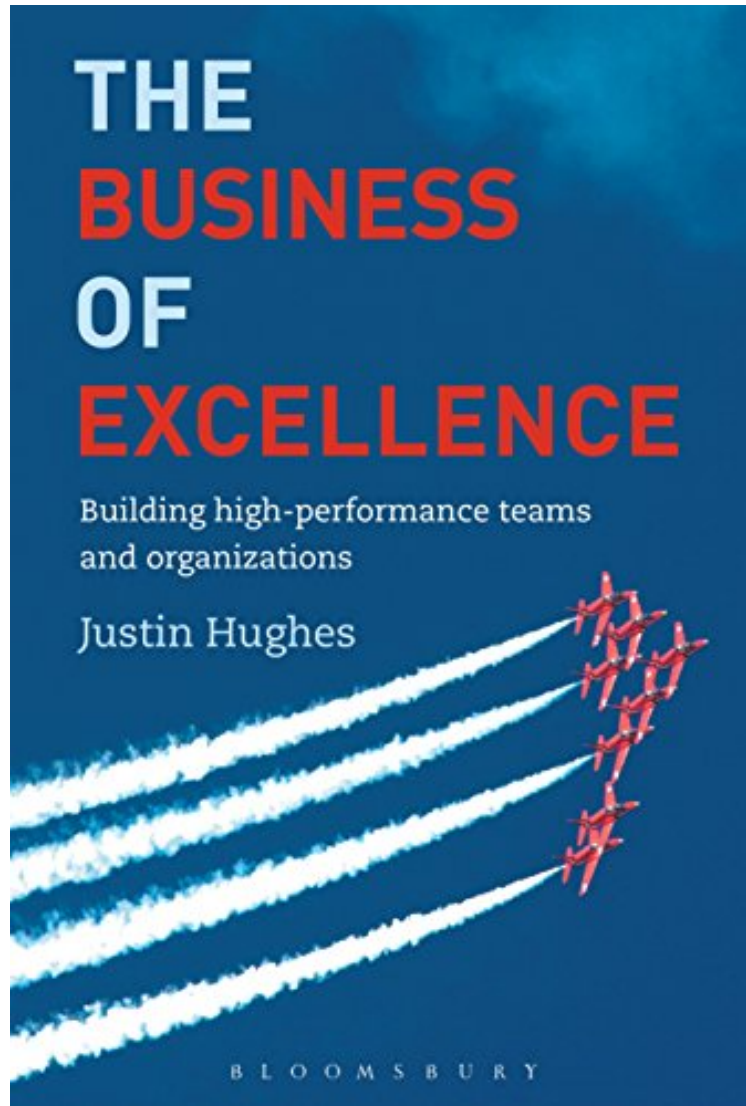

The author provides guidance through fascinating examples drawn from his experiences not only as one of the top fighter pilots in the British Royal Air Force (as proven through his selection to one of the elite aerial display teams, the Red Arrows, in the world) but also through his experiences directly in the corporate world as well as the knowledge he has procured working with clients in his current career running a consulting firm, Mission Excellence, that specializes in organizational and team performance. He draws examples from historical and modern day thought leaders, as well as Fortune 500 companies, world class athletics teams, Government run agencies, NGOs, and his experiences in the military and working with militaries from around the world. This is a valuable read for people in traditional roles of leadership, however, it illustrates just how people in any role can lead, even if not traditionally a leadership or management role. As anyone who has worked in a professional environment knows, being a manager does not always correlate with being a leader. Anyone who reads this highly engaging book will immediately be able to apply it to his or her profession. It forces you to reflect not only on the work environment that you operate in, but also to make an honest assessment of how you operate and perform and what impression that leaves on those around you (and above and below you on the org chart). Working in a test lead role within an extensive team and vast and varying stakeholders, I immediately was able to draw examples from my own career where I would have benefitted from having read this book when I was first starting out 13 years ago. That said, even with more than a decade under my belt, I will still be bringing ample lessons and guidance instilled through the book back to the office with me on Monday. I recommend this book to everyone. I know, not very specific, but it is rare in this day and age that anyone can work completely independently. Whether it is direct reports or contractors or clients, the lessons Mr. Hughes provides are extremely important to working with others and forming high performance teams (even if you, like me, only get to fly a high performance laptop and not a \$20+ million dollar fighter jet). One of my favorite insights from the book is that Excellence is a habit. You have the control in your own day to day work, your career and even your own life to make excellence routine. No one else can do that for you. The author systematically and strategically takes you through his high performance model elaborating on the aspects of "People," "Capability," and "Delivery" that are valued and exemplified throughout the corporate, military, and government worlds. And we are all the beneficiaries of his clarity of thought and well informed guidance. Read this book!

I have read dozens of books on leadership and team building so I am very hard to impress but this is one I would highly recommend. The author is a consultant; entrepreneur and ex-RAF fighter pilot and all of these disparate roles come through in the writing. You can feel the sense of honor one would expect from someone with such an impressive British military background, but the focus and structure of the book is squarely on the practical and the executable. Especially when he talks about exhibiting a set of behaviors that others will "choose" to follow. It is an outcome-based guide to becoming the role model for others that we all aspire to be in life and in business. He also places a significant focus on attitude and behavior in high-performance teams. Having worked in such teams, my experience is that many people give lip service to honesty, transparency and objectivity but have trouble living up to them. The author contends that they are such foundational leadership attributes that it is hard to build a culture of "excellence" without them. I couldn't agree more. In general, I found the writing excellent and the author's overall recommendations very compelling. I know many organizations that could benefit from applying the principles he espouses.

The Business of Excellence offers a unique and compelling perspective on the drivers of excellence in teams and organizations. The material includes a proprietary performance model that can be applied to a wide spectrum of organizations, focusing on:

- Capability: building alignment before setting people free

- Leadership: exhibiting a set of behaviours such that others choose to follow
- Risk: avoiding the victory of compliance over outcomes.
